Stephen Courter Lecturer, Dept. of Mgmt University of Texas

Professor Stephen Courter is an awardwinning faculty member in the department of management at UT Austin and a former top corporate executive with experience worldwide.

Following graduation from Penn State, Courter served in the US Army, reaching the rank of Major. After stints at KPMG and IBM, he became Vice-President and General Manager of Sprint/Global One in Brussels, Belgium in 1987, where he worked until 1998. He became CEO of Enertel Communications in Rotterdam, The Netherland, and later served as CEO and Chairman of Neon Communication in Boston. In 2006, he became CEO of Broadwing

Communications in Austin, and led the organization until its purchase in 2007 by Level 3 Communications.

Professor Courter's academic career began at the University of Maryland in 1981, where he taught for fourteen years, and later at Bryant University, where he taught in 2005-2006. He joined The University of Texas in 2007. His areas of interest include corporate diversification; mergers, acquisitions and divestitures; and venture capital. In recent years has conducted several MBA Global Connections work study programs to Viet Nam, Indonesia, Thailand and India, facilitating consulting projects for large companies in those countries.

Colonel (retired) J. Craig Flowers is a native Texan originally from San Antonio. His more than 25 years in the US Army encompassed a decade overseas, including three years in North Africa and ten years in direct support of the special operations community. His final military assignment was at West Point where he served as senior staff officer, Director of Cadet Affairs and Assistant Baseball Coach.

Craig currently works as a consultant for Horizon Performance assisting in the assessment, selection and development of NASA astronauts, special operators

and elite NCAA athletics programs. He is also the Founder of The Sideline Leadership Company, which works with Coaches and Corporations on Character, Culture and Leadership Development. He has often presented on developmental and communication techniques to best reach and teach today's generation of student-athletes as they progress through the challenges of high school years.

He is often heard on FM 104.9 'The Horn' as a guest co-host for the "B&E Show" and has his own radio show "Zero 900", streamed online at HornFM.com. Craig attended Texas Christian University earning a degree in Economics while playing baseball for the Horned Frogs. He holds a M.A. from Kansas University.

Captain Brian Teets, a native of Urbana, Ohio, received his commission in March of 1990 through the Navy ROTC program at Ohio State University where he earned a BSBA in Production and Operations Management.

Captain Teets' first shore tour in 1995 was as Aide to the Commander, Naval Training Center Great Lakes, IL, and then to the Chief of Naval Education and Training in Pensacola, FL, dual-hatted as the Director of Navy Training, CNO. He reported aboard the USS Enterprise in 1997 as the Operations Administration Officer where he qualified as Officer of the Deck and deployed in 1998 to the Arabian Gulf taking part in Operation Desert Fox. He also served aboard the USS Ingraham, deploying to the Indian Ocean/Arabian Gulf 2001 for Opera-

tion Enduring Freedom. He detached in 2002 and reported to the Officer Plans and Promotions office on the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations. He received an M.S. in National Security Strategy and a M.A. in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College in 2006.

In May 2008 he assumed command of the HSL-37 "Easyriders" aboard MCBH at Kaneohe Bay, HI, and in August 2009 he completed his command tour and reported to the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Strategic Plans and Policy Directorate where he specialized in International Security Cooperation and Foreign Military Sales policy.

Following his tour as Executive Officer, Captain Teets assumed command of the amphibious assault ship USS Wasp in July 2013 and conducted at-sea testing trials for the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter, and executed a \$250M ship modernization overhaul. In June 2015 he assumed command of the Naval ROTC Unit at the University of Texas at Austin.

Schuyler Williamson graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, and was the first person to be drafted and play professional baseball out of USMA. After playing for the Detroit Tigers, Schuyler graduated from multiple Army schools, including Army Ranger School, and served for nearly six years as a combat arms officer in the Army with the 1st Cavalry and 82nd Airborne Divisions. He served overseas in both Iraq and Afghanistan. In his post-Army career, Schuyler graduated from The University of Texas at Austin McCombs School of Business with his MBA, served as the Director of Membership Divisions for Keller Williams Realty International, and served as the Director of Client Success at Career-Plug, an Austin-based software firm.
